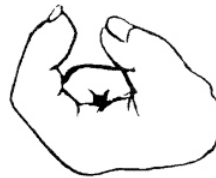
Thumb not shown so

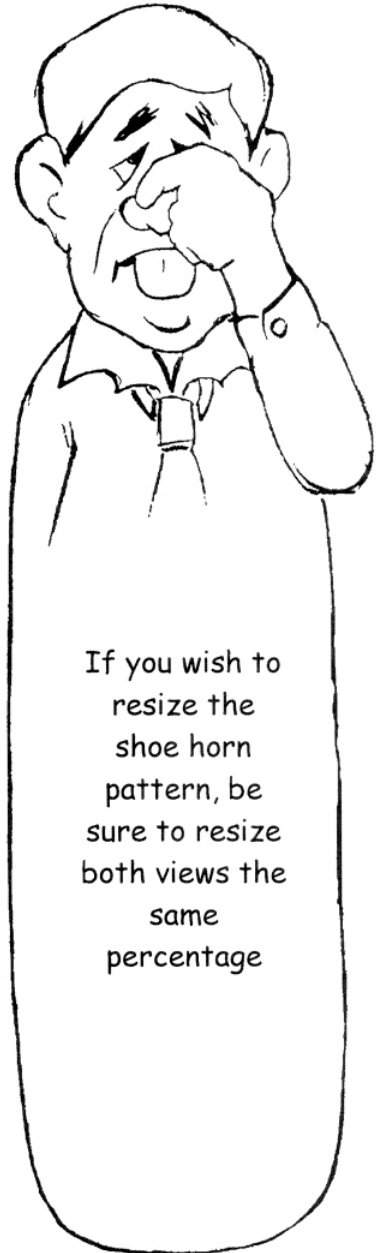
Detail of his face behind

## A Shoehorn That Makes A Statement

This was the first pattern I did for the July/August issue of Chip Chats in 1997, over 20 years ago. I thought I'd revise it for a new generation of carvers. I used maple for the one I carved but any suitable hardwood do. You could even extend the length it so that it could be used while standing up. For maximum the grain should be in the direction of the length of the horn.
